

MACKENZIE, C. R. (D.S.O. L.G. 25.10.16); b. 3.5.92; s. of Alexander Linton Mackenzie and Marion Patrick Mackenzie; educ. Font-hill, E. Grinstead; Winchester, and Trinity College, Cambridge; Commander Colin Roy Mackenzie joined the Royal Navy on the declaration of war, 1914, as an Assistant Surgeon; was sent to the Spitfire (torpedo destroyer), and remained there for 10 months,

FLIGHT-COMMANDER COLIN ROY MACKENZIE, D.S.O. (I, 1905--1910)—son of A. L. Mackenzie Esq., of Bath—was born on May 3rd, 1892, and came to Winchester from Mr. Radcliffe's school at East Grinstead. He was appointed a Commoner Prefect in 1909 and was a member of Sixth Book; he also shot two years in Wimbledon VIII and played in O.T.H. XV.

He rendered conspicuous services during the war in the Royal Naval Air Service, being awarded the D.S.O. and the Croix de Guerre, and twice mentioned in Despatches. He was killed at Bihucourt, near Bapaume, on January 24th, 1917.
